JUDGE'S CORNER



Another Trip Around The Sun

A belated, but no less heart-felt, Happy New Year from everyone at the 11th District Court of Appeals! We all wish you a healthy and purposeful 2026 as you continue your fine work as part of our shared goal of keeping “Justice for All” a priority in Ohio.

2025 brought a noteworthy change to our Court. In February, we welcomed Ashtabula County’s own Scott Lynch to the Court following his election in November 2024. Judge Lynch has hit the ground running; he is a tireless worker and a deep thinker who displays the kind of collegiality that serves us, and The People, well. Welcome Judge Lynch!

I have reported to you in past LLV columns about our Court’s leadership selection process. In December, I was elected Administrative Judge, and Judge Matt Lynch was elected to serve as Presiding Judge, for calendar 2026. As many of you know, Judge Matt Lynch now is our longest tenured Judge on the Court. We all have great confidence in his ability not only to lead panels to which he is assigned, but also to help shape the Court’s policies and to lead meetings of the Judges as we act (or choose not to act) on future initiatives.

As Administrative Judge, I will do everything I can to make the appellate process in the 11th District as efficient and transparent as it can be. But, let there be no doubt, our unified objective on the Court is to get the cases that come before us right – every time. As important as expedition and efficiency are, nothing surpasses getting it right.

Our efforts to meet the Ohio Supreme Court’s past mandates and recommendations for preparedness and emergency response issues in Ohio Courts are ongoing. Suffice to say that through the efforts of the Court’s committee formed in 2024, our administrative staff and Judges Lucci and Patton who I appointed to lead our efforts, we are nearing our goal.

Our record in 2025 on the timely processing of matters before us remains solid. We continue to be within the Supreme Court’s guidance for timely processing of appeals.

But, one issue has arisen that deserves comment: Requests to postpone scheduled oral arguments. To review, we generally give notice of dates scheduled for argument or submission six to ten weeks in advance. Your County Clerk of Courts docket these notices and they are available through ordinary procedures. Most importantly, they are explicit: Any request to postpone the argument must be made within 7 days of the notice. See, Local Rule 21(C).

We strive to be mindful of the pressures on counsels’ schedules, and other relevant circumstances, in considering timely motions on this issue. However, rescheduling hearings through untimely motions can mean months of delay. Therefore, untimely motions are allowed only “upon a showing of exceptional circumstances.” *Id.* So, if a hearing schedule poses a problem, move timely. If you don’t, an untimely motion may not be considered (much less granted) absent the required showing.

On a related note, let me issue our annual call for all litigants with matters before the Court to think seriously about embracing and using our Court-sponsored mediation program. It has proven effective often enough to convince me that it should be on every appellate counsel's check list of things to explore, particularly in civil cases. Our Administrative Counsel and Court Administrator, Shibani-Sheth Massacci, oversees the program, and has earned the confidence of the Court (which I am sure you will share) to make it a productive exercise.

Finally, you all know that 2026 will mark the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. To help celebrate our freedoms and the role our justice system plays in protecting them we are reinitiating our "Courtroom in the Classroom" program. It involves holding oral arguments on active cases in high schools throughout the District, along with educational and explanatory materials. Special thanks to Judge Lucci for spearheading this effort and the Judges, our staff and local school and law enforcement personnel for lending their shoulders to the wheel.

You are all doing important work in the administration of justice in Ohio, and we are all grateful for your continued efforts. Please don't let up; many hands make light work.

HIGH SCHOOL MOCK TRIAL DISTRICT RESULTS

On January 30, 2026, 12 teams from 7 different schools competed at the Lake County Courthouse in the Ohio Center for Law-Related Education's annual District Mock Trial Competition. Teams from Mentor, Lake Catholic, Andrews Osborne Academy, Notre Dame—Cathedral Latin (NDCL), Kenston, Hawken, and Chagrin Falls argued before panels of 3 judges. The case this year dealt with the very interesting and timely topic of using genealogical DNA from ancestry databases maintained by private companies to solve crimes.

Each team consisted of lawyers and witnesses. Trials were conducted in the morning and afternoon. The judges consisted of elected judges from the Lake County Court of Common Pleas General Division, Domestic Relations Division, Probate Division, Eleventh District Court of Appeals, and local practicing attorneys. After both trials were completed, the following teams earned the right to advance to the Regional competition: Kenston Team 1, Kenston Team 3, and Lake Catholic.

This event could not have been held without many volunteers. There were six panels hearing cases. The panels consisted of the following: Judge Eugene A. Lucci, Kristi Winner, and Tim Kucharski; Judge Vincent A. Culotta, Sophia DeChurch, and Magistrate Michael Barth; Judge John P. O'Donnell, Judge Robert J. Patton, and Teri Daniel; Judge Colleen A. Falkowski, Nina Germano, and Jim Mathews; Judge Mark J. Bartolotta, Jim Carrabine, and Jennifer McGee; Judge Patrick J. Condon, Thad Cwiklinski, and Carolyn Kucharski.

The judges were assisted by the following bailiffs, respectively: Anthony Iliano; Stan Shadowen; Bob Gonzalez; Kevin McCabe; Peter Huth; and Brian Jackson. Sandy Murphy from the Lake County Law Library and Susan Goodell from Judge Condon's staff checked in all of the participants. Kelly Echols from the Lake County Prosecutor's Office and Bridget Kronik from Judge Condon's staff tallied all of the scores and made sure everything ran smoothly. As always, a generous donation from the Lake County Bar Association Foundation paid for the food for the volunteers.

The Regional competition will be held on February 20, 2026, at the Lake County Courthouse.

OVERVIEW

The Eleventh District Court of Appeals is accepting applications for a judicial attorney position. The judicial staff attorney is responsible for conducting legal research, reviewing legal documents and issues, and drafting memoranda and opinions at the judge's direction. The starting salary range is \$90,000 to \$105,000, depending on experience, plus benefits.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The following duties are usual for this position. These duties as outlined are not to be construed as exclusive or inclusive. Other duties may be required or assigned.

- Conduct legal research on substantive and procedural issues relating to the judge's assigned cases and issues requested by the judge.
- Establish thorough knowledge of relevant portions of assigned case files, review parties' merit briefs, and prepare written memoranda, bench briefs, draft opinions, and revisions per the judge's instructions.
- Cite check and edit documents to produce a polished, professional, final document.
- Attend court hearings and conferences as requested by the judge.
- Research and draft decisions on post-judgment motions, including motions for reconsideration, reopening, certification of a conflict, and en banc review.
- Stay current on legal issues and legislation as necessary to perform required duties.
- Attend CLE courses and take all other actions necessary to maintain good standing with the Ohio Bar.
- Cooperate with the judges, administrators, and co-workers to accomplish the court's work in the most efficient way possible.
- Perform other duties as assigned by the judges or the court administrator.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS and ABILITIES

- Excellent interpersonal skills and ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing, with judges and staff.
- Thorough knowledge of applicable and relevant laws and rules of practice and procedure.
- Proven analytical and legal research skills and attention to detail and accuracy.

- Ability to conduct legal research utilizing automated research services.
- Ability to analyze legal questions from different areas of the law and to formulate and present recommendations to the assigned judge(s).
- Ability to effectively manage a large case docket and produce work product of exceptional quality.
- Ability to complete assigned work without specific direction or instruction regarding manner of completion within given deadlines.
- Familiarity with Court operations and procedure.
- Effective time management, reliability, and punctuality.
- Ability to maintain sensitive and confidential information and exercise sound discretion and to maintain the highest ethical standards.
- Ability to maintain effective, professional work relationships with co-workers and judges.
- Professional appearance and demeanor at all times.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

Requires a Juris Doctor (J.D.) degree and admission to the Ohio Bar. Applicant must possess strong legal research and writing skills and the ability to proofread documents for proper grammar, punctuation, and spelling. Requires proficiency with Microsoft Office products, internet, Westlaw and other legal research resources. Requires the ability to work independently with minimal direct supervision and the ability to prioritize duties.

The normal work hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Salary is commensurate with experience. The Court offers health, vision, dental, and life insurance; employer contribution to the state retirement plan (OPERS); paid vacation, personal and sick time.
